Like many of you, she is an academic superstar and serves as Secretary in the Inaugural Class of the Harvard Debate Council Diversity Project.

The Harvard Debate Council Diversity Project is a program that trains 25 African American students in debate and public speaking. Those 25 students compete at the Harvard Debate Council Summer Residency Program. While debating at the summer residency program, Allison and her debate partner competed in a single elimination debate competition and advanced to the Elite 8 teams out of 400 participants.
